- **Reason (R):** Colonisation stimulated new investments and improvements in transport.

**Reason (R):** Some of the Naipaul's early novels capture their sense of loss and alienation.

**Reason (R):** The value of Indian exports to Britain was much higher than the value of British imports to India.

**Reason (R):** Before the First World War, Asia was a major supplier of wheat in the world market.

**Reason (R):** The fall in agricultural prices was greater and more prolonged than that in the prices of industrial goods.

#### **ANSWER KEY**

**Q.1**: (a) The reason explains why the system of fixed exchange rates collapsed, and is true.

**Q.2**: (d) The Portuguese and Spanish conquest and colonisation of America was decisively under way by the mi^- sixteenth century. The most powerful weapon of the Spanish conquerors was not a conventional military weapon but they carried germs of small pox on themselves. Thus, both the assertion and reason are false.

- **Q.3**: (a) Technological advances were often the result of larger, social, political and economic factors, like colonization. Thus reason is the correct explanation of the assertion.
- **Q.4**: (b) The reason and assertion do not match each other.
